


Kid Pix Worksheet Ideas



A Kid Pix worksheet is easy to create, and even easier for students to understand and use. Special tools, rubber stamps, and the Record Sound... option (in the Goodies menu) are just a few ways you can make curricula more accessible -- and more fun!!! Kid Pix worksheets can be completed on-screen or printed out. Save the worksheet as **stationery** so that several students can use it without changing the original. Use these ideas as starting points:

Kids connect the sizes with the line tool  in a worksheet on clothing. Enlarge stamps by pressing o &/or q when clicking on the screen.
